900 feet of single track without features, 75 feet of bench cut single track and 2,100 feet of single track trail alignment on the mountain bike trails.

750 feet of boardwalk, 150 feet of turnpike, 20 yards of gravel positioning and 85 pieces of lumber positioning on the Superior Hiking Trail.
